25th Sunday of Ordinary Time B

Reading I: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20

Responsorial Psalm 54:3-4, 5, 6, 8

Reading II: James 3:16-4:3

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37



In the First Reading from the Book of Wisdom, "the wicked" practice a much extended version of childish self-interest. They say, in effect: Look at this righteous one. He thinks he is so wonderful. Let's take his high opinion of himself and test it with rejection and torture. Let us see what a slow death will do to someone supposedly so patient and gentle. Holiness is all a sham, a way for people to get what they want. We do not need this God stuff. All these are seductively false. We humans can become truly and freely human by putting God in first place, valuing everything else in relation to God's love, especially power, wealth, and pride. Who are the "just ones" who endure persecution by the wicked ones today? Might we be considered obnoxious because we speak out against unjust things?

The Responsorial Psalm reaffirms our belief that God will defend us, listen to us, sustain us, and give us renewed life. It calls us to praise God because of His goodness each day.

James warns in the Second Reading. "Where jealousy and self ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice," Where

does ambition for power and greatness lead? What does it do to a country, a business, a Church? Are there more ways to cultivate peace? To this apostle, James, true wisdom is pure, peaceful, full of mercy, without inconsistency or insincerity. Often, we are too concerned with getting the respect we think we are due in society in general, in our home, workplace or school. We may have to put up with a boss who is unjust and endure him until he is replaced or we find another job, but we respect the boss who treats everyone fairly. Those still in school often give far too much deference to popular classmates, to the members of an athletic team, or even to the funniest. James writes that the best people are those who are kind, compassionate, just, and full of mercy. As Christians, the basic attitude of our relationship with others must be that of Jesus Christ, the way of service.

In the Gospel today, Jesus rebukes his disciples for arguing about who among them was first and greatest. Jesus instructs them on how to get to be first: you have to be the servant of all. Jesus hugs a child and says that if we receive such a child, we receive him. Pope Francis...has been praised for welcoming the least among us, for not looking at privilege as a sign of one's worth. Let us keep him in our prayers that he be safe, that he touches our hearts and teaches us how to recognize the least among us. *(This Reflection first appeared in the Holy Name bulletin for September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015. ## **What is ARISE Together in Christ?**

ARISE Together in Christ is a program from Renew International providing a parish spiritual renewal and evangelization process. The goal is to help people become better hearers and doers of the Word of God by encouraging and supporting the formation of small communities as sharing groups where individuals seek to grow in faith and in their relationship with God and one another.

The ARISE process invited us to make a six week journey each Fall and Spring, for a total of five seasons. We will explore key scriptural themes and connect them with living out our Catholic faith. Participants will meet weekly in a faith sharing group of 8-12 individuals either in homes or at the parish.

## **ARISE Typical Meeting Agenda**

In ARISE, small faith-sharing groups meet seeking to grow in faith and their relationship with God and one another. Meetings are held in homes or on the parish campus. Each Season of ARISE meets once a week for only six weeks and each session lasts approximately 90 minutes. The meetings include:

- Introductions
- Opening Prayer
- Reflecting on Our Story
- Scripture Reading
- Sharing
- Reflecting on the Reading
- Invitation to Act
- Closing Prayer

## What is ARISE?

**ARISE TOGETHER IN CHRIST** is run by **RENEW INTERNATIONAL** and has been in 150 dioceses in the United States and in 25 different countries – About 75 parishes in Brooklyn and Queens have already signed up.

ARISE is small groups of faith sharing based on scripture and held in the parish or homes. It is five 6-week seasons over 3 years to meet once a week for 1 ½ hours beginning in early October 2016. One season will be in the fall and another season will be in the spring.

The ARISE Team will be signing people up during the weekends of September 15<sup>th</sup>/16<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>/23<sup>rd</sup> for small groups. There will be a trained facilitator for each group.
